Short Synopsis

The play is set in Venice, Italy. Bassanio wants to marry a woman called Portia but he cannot afford to travel to Belmont to see her, so he asks his friend Antonio if he can borrow some money. Antonia, an antisemitic merchant, has his money tied up in his ships out at sea. Antonio asks for a loan from the Jew Shylock on behalf of his friend Bassanio. Shylock agrees to lend him the money, but says If the money is not repaid, Shylock will take a pound of Antonio's flesh.

Portia's deceased father left a test in his will that she will marry whichever suitor makes the correct choice when presented with the three caskets, made of gold, silver and lead. Portia and her maid Nerissa watch as several suitors try to win her love, but they all fail.

Bassanio arrives in Belmont and correctly chooses the lead casket, winning Portia's hand in marriage. Portia is delighted. They marry and his friend Gratiano marries Portia's maid, Nerissa, at the same time. Shylock's daughter, Jessica escapes from his house so that she can marry Lorenzo. Lorenzo is a Christian and a friend of Bassanio.

Antonio's ships are lost at sea, meaning he has no way to repay Shylock and will have to face him in court. Portia, now Bassanio's wife, dresses as a lawyer and travels to Venice to save Antonio. She asks Shylock to be merciful, but he is determined to have his revenge. Portia examines the original contract between them. She tells the court Shylock can only take a pound of his flesh if he spills no blood and Shylock admits this is not possible. Shylock is punished by court for attempting to kill a citizen of Venice. All of his wealth is seized and he is forced to convert to Christianity.
